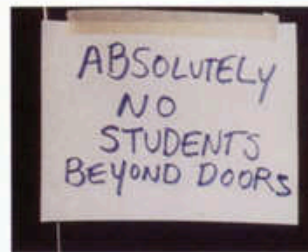

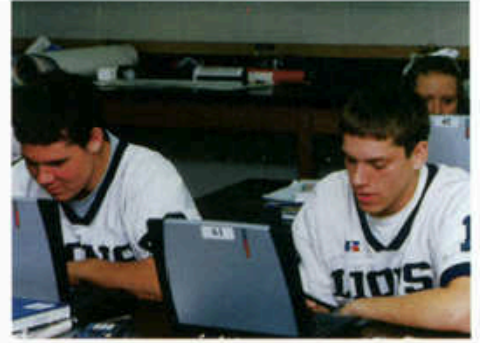

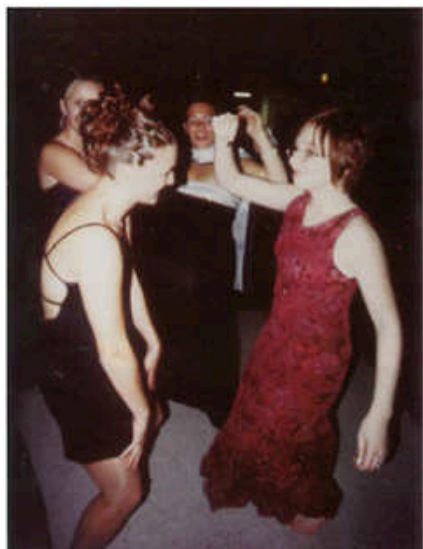

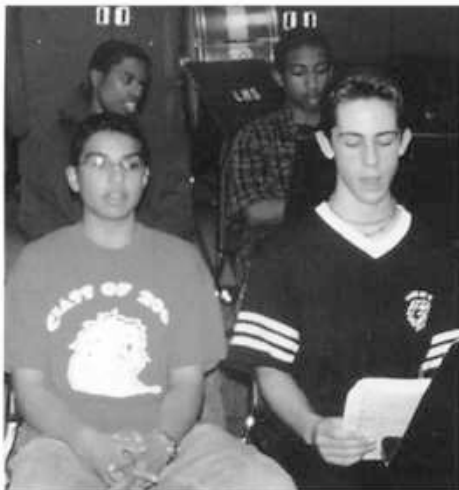

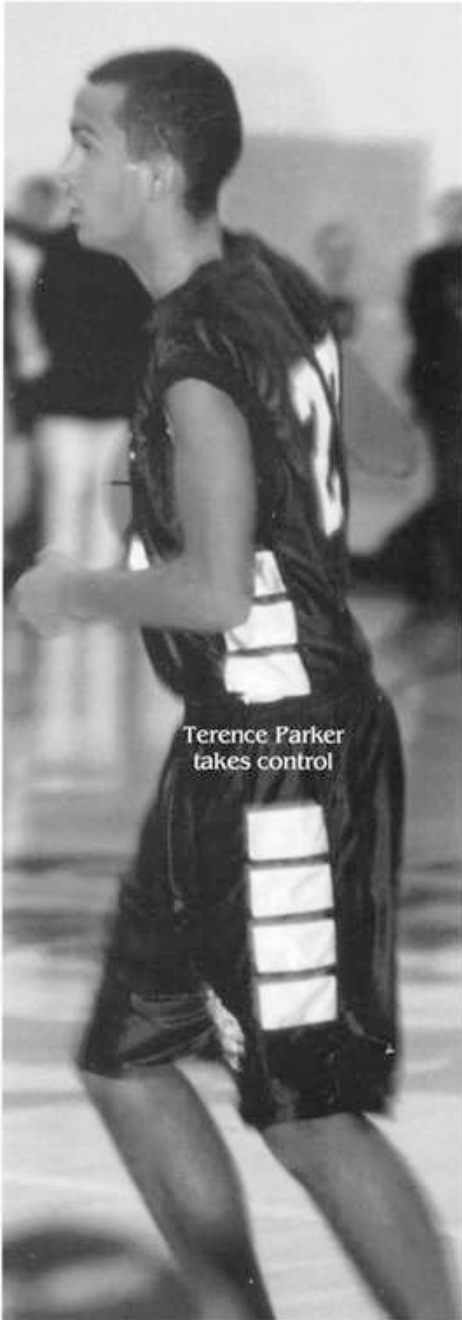


Kings of the Court

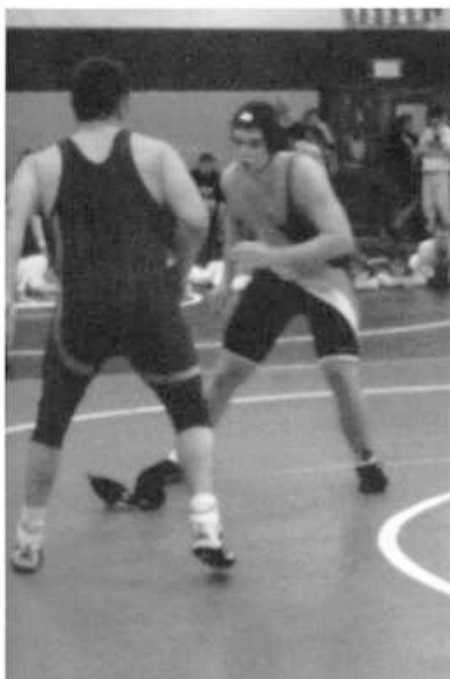

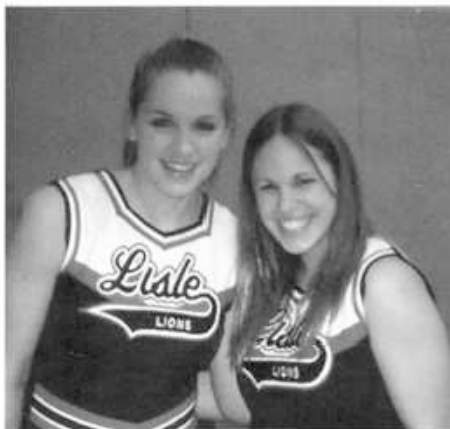

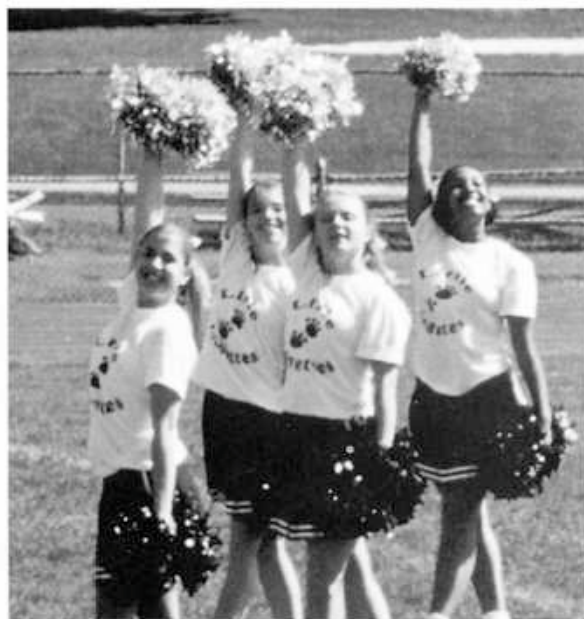

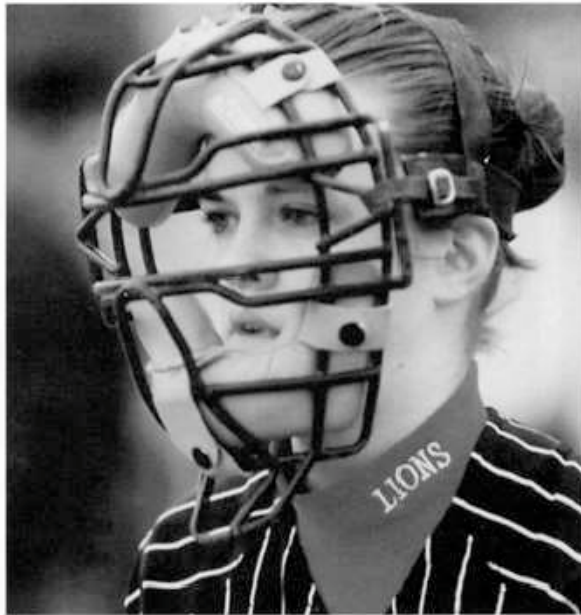
