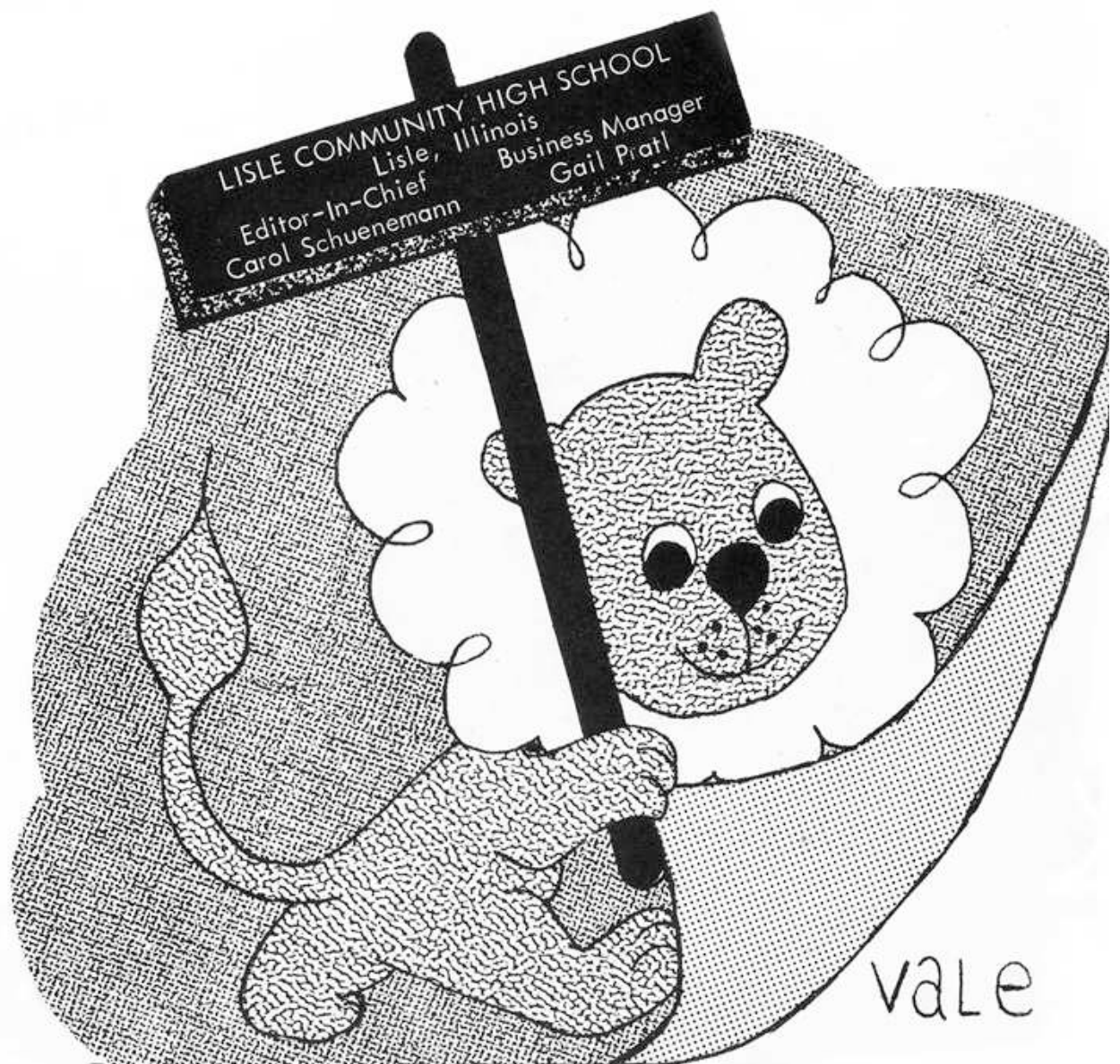

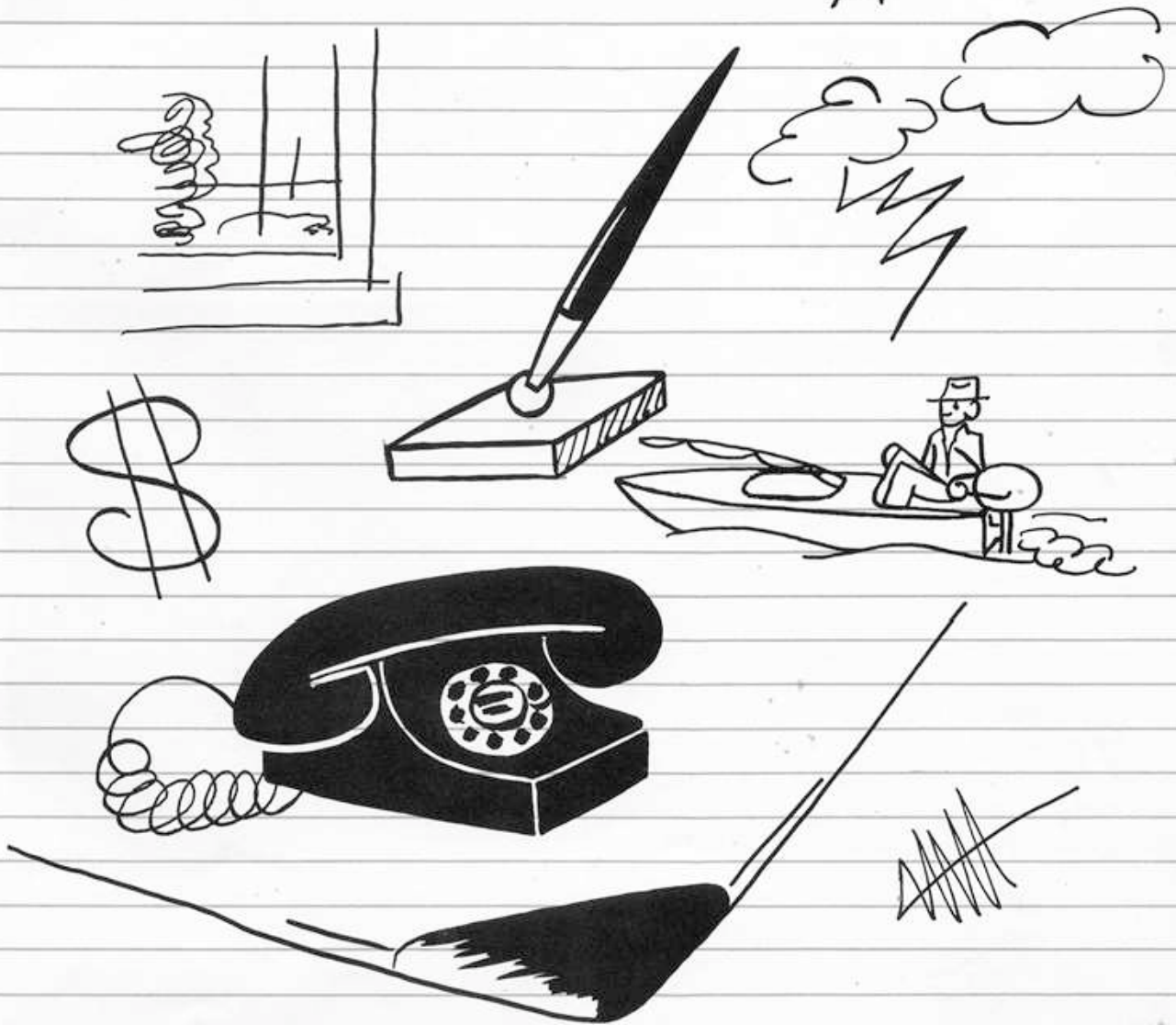

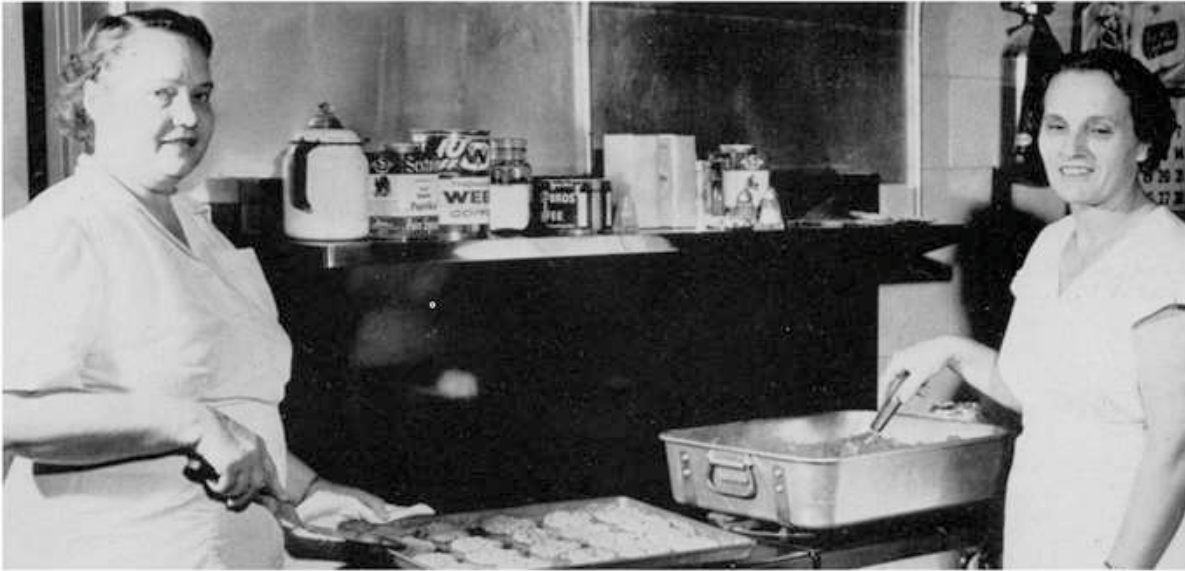
The administration is actually the nerve center of the school, controlling all its functions. Upon their shoulders rests the responsibility of keeping the school running smoothly and efficiently.
