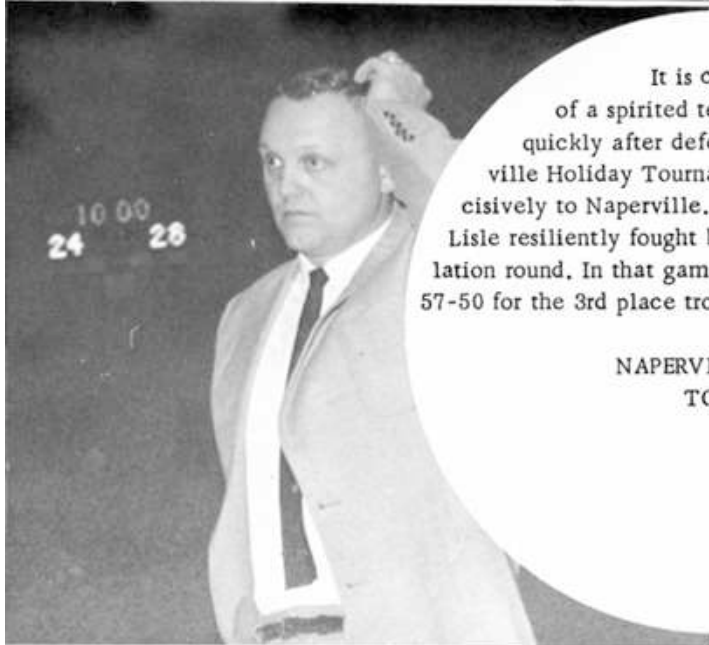
Next season promises to be even better, as a host of returning lettermen are expected to capably fill the vacancies.

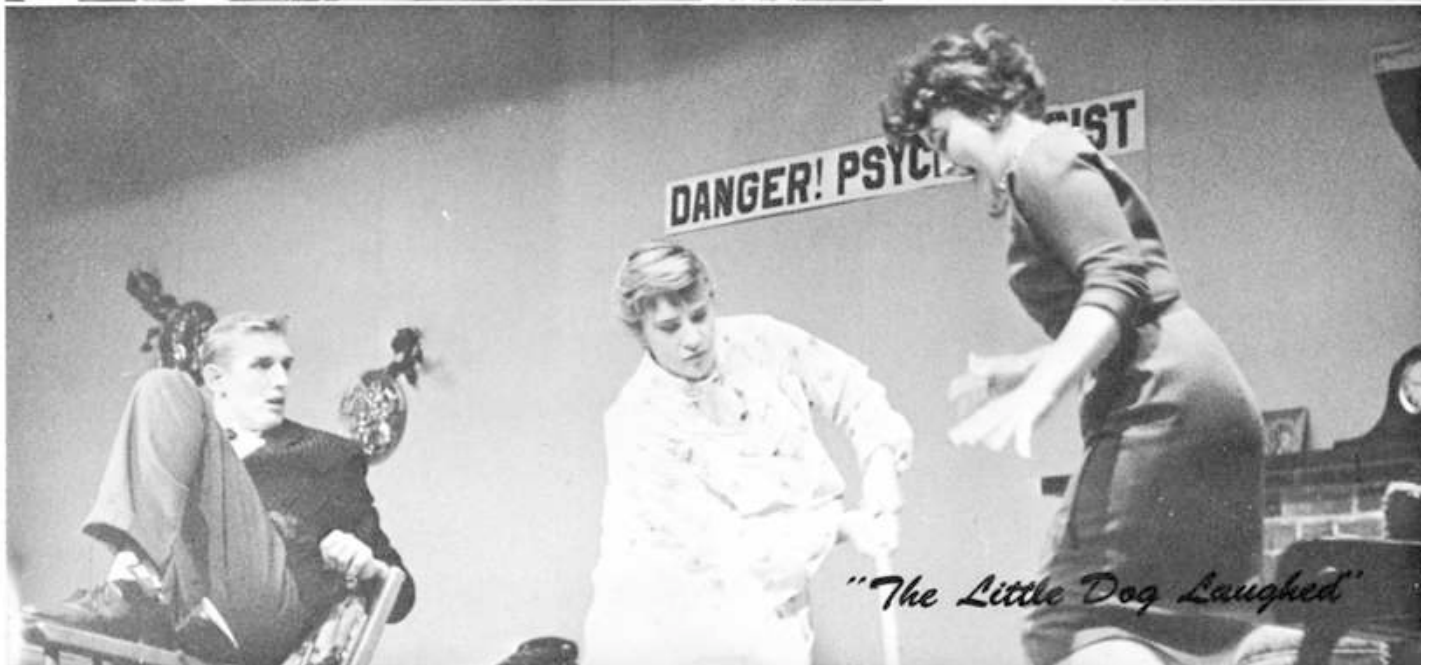
To Penny Glassman came the overwhelming joy that only an instant of time can bring, as she was decorated Homecoming Queen of 1960.

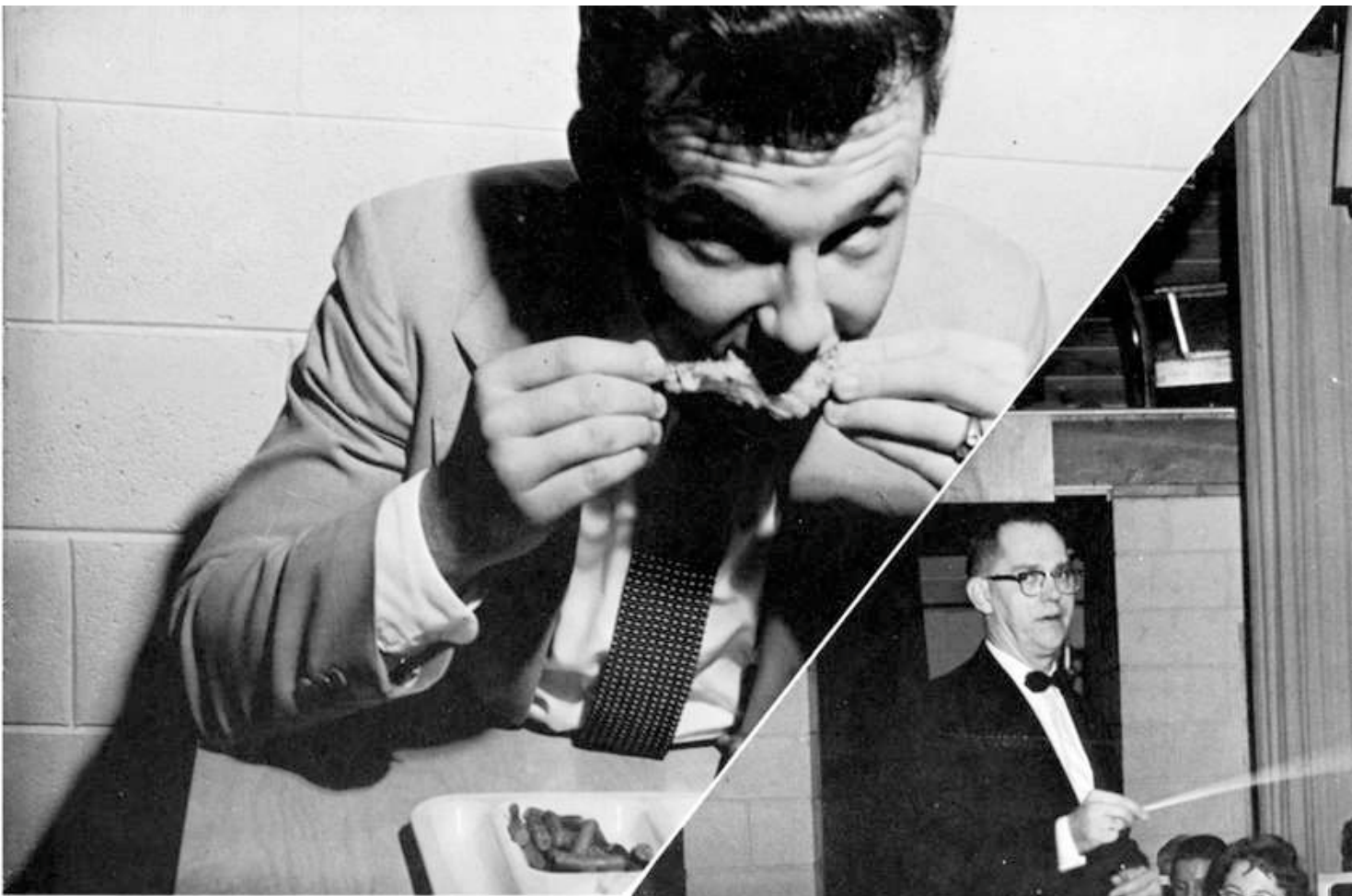
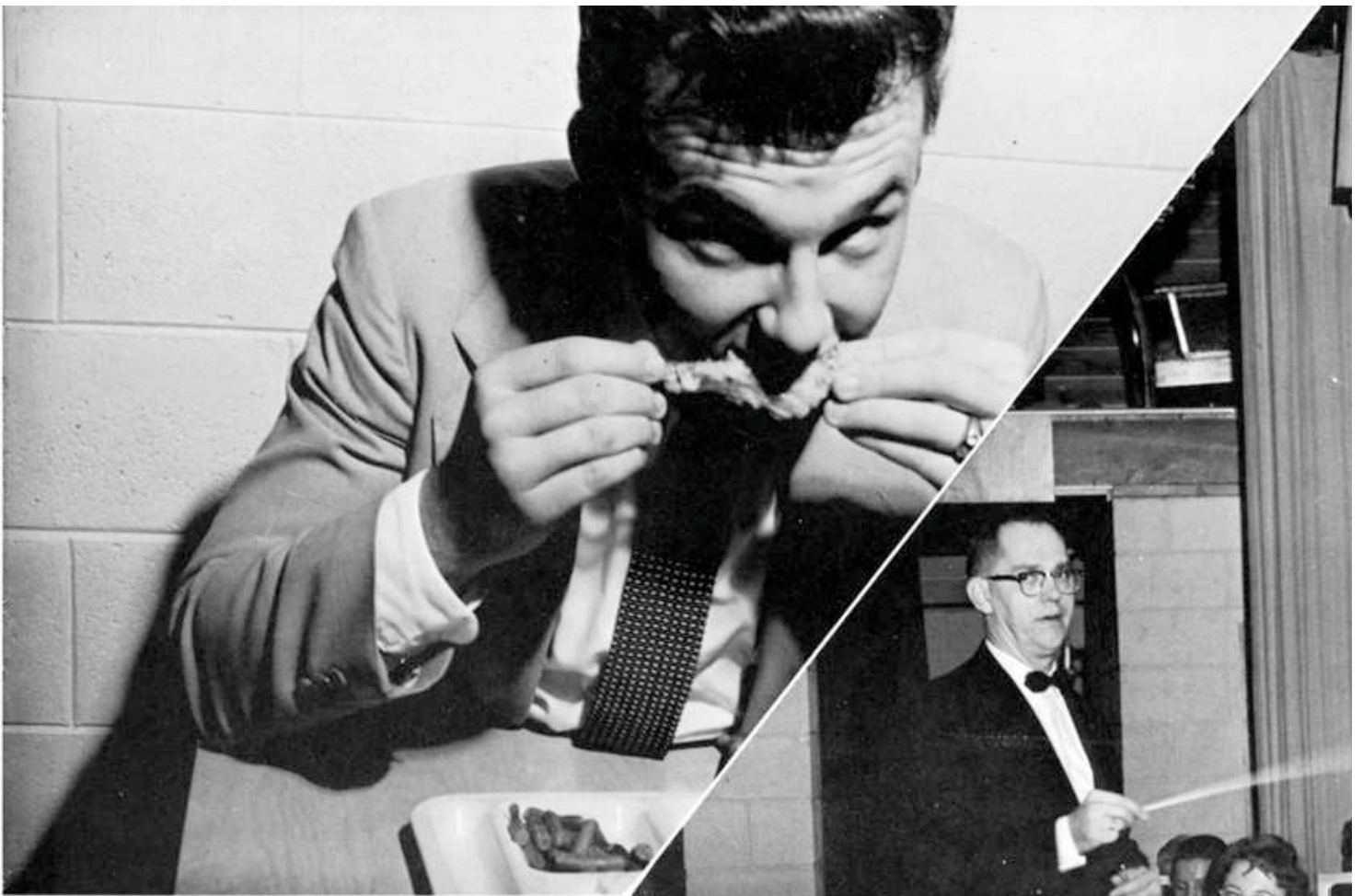
