PEP CLUB



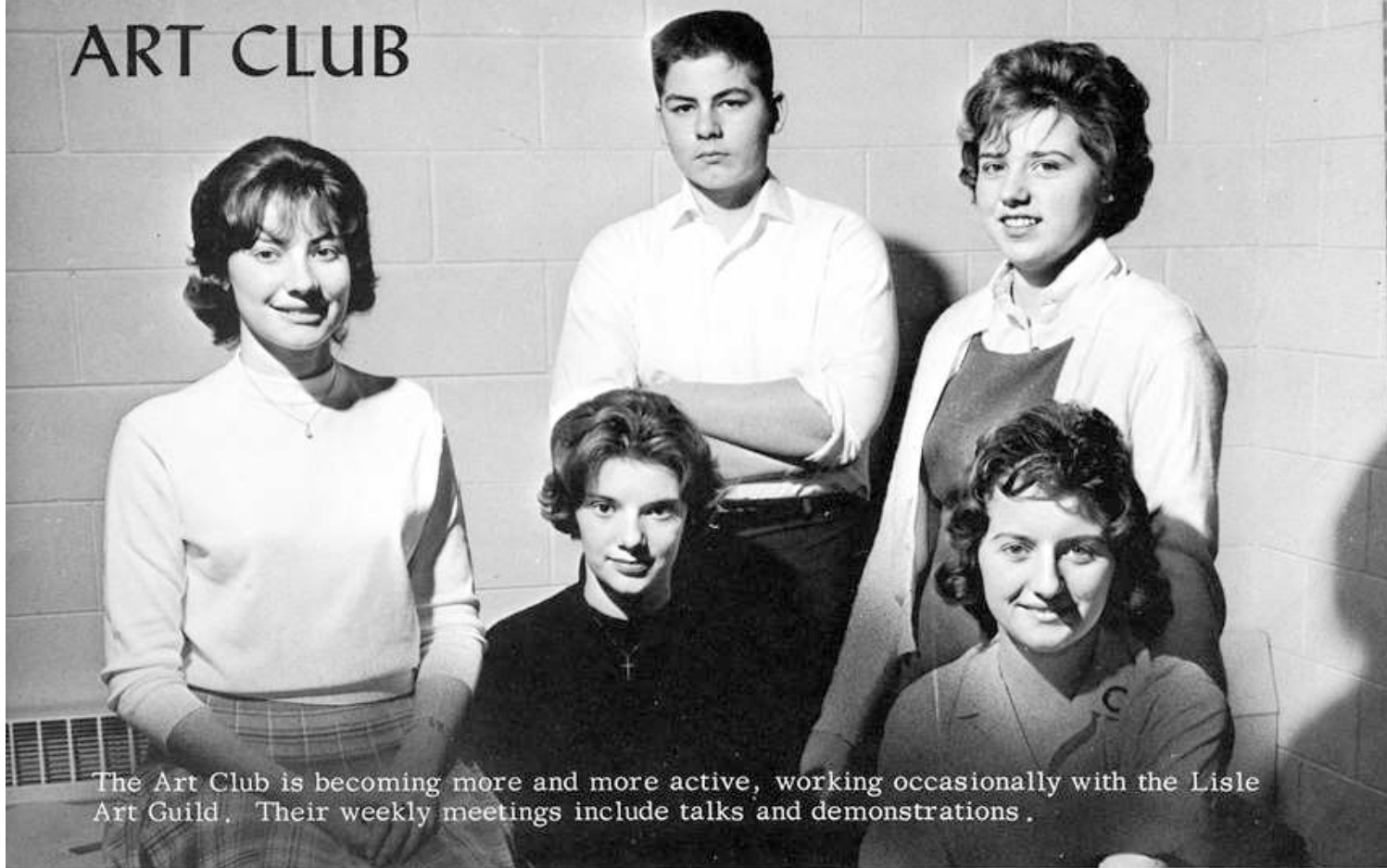
The Pep Club had a late start this year, but they have contributed greatly to our school spirit. Their enthusiasm is apparent at all of our athletic events.

Each year our chorus gains experience and becomes more and more versatile. This group



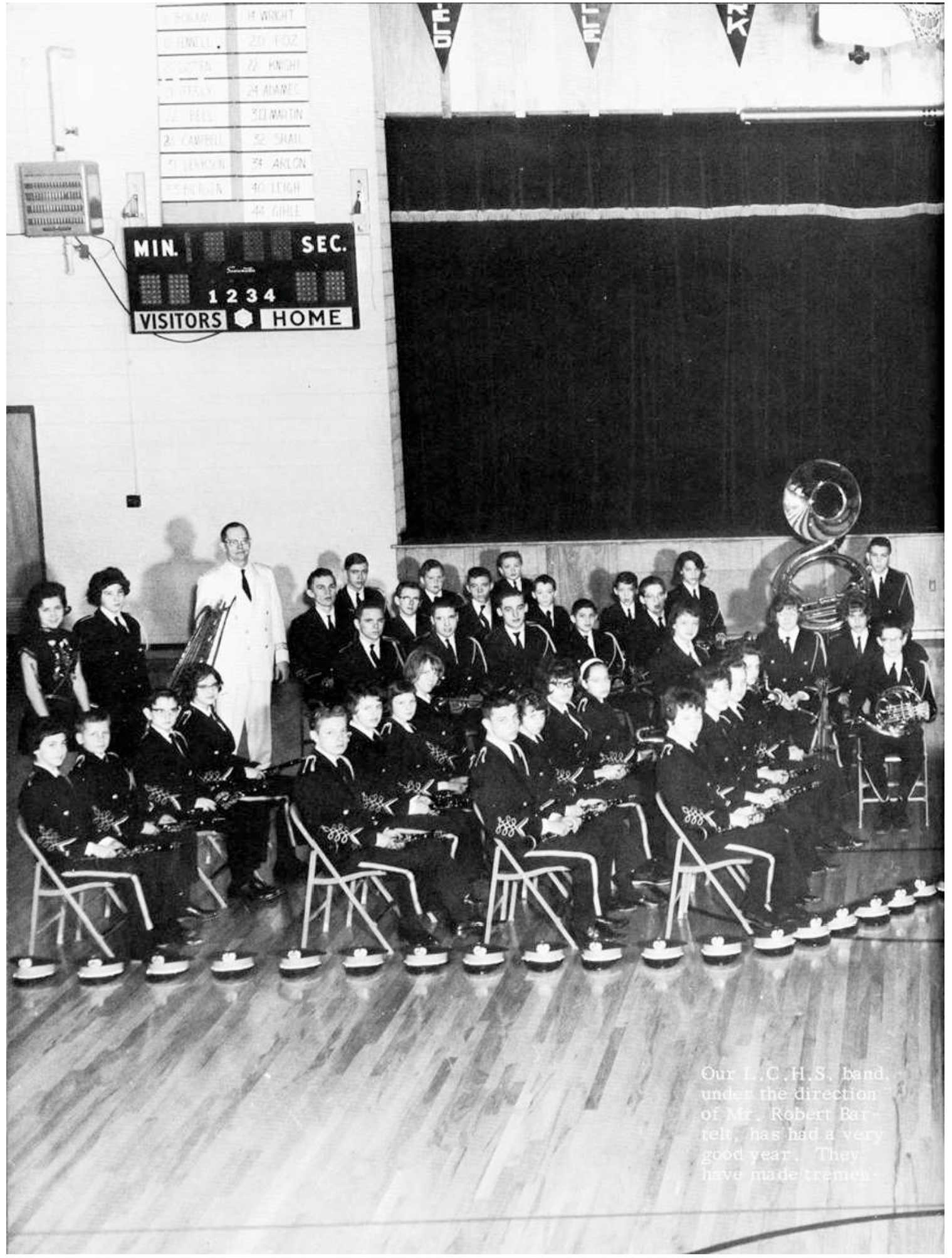

not a loss, for at each game there was tremendous school spirit and a great team effort. We can only say "Wait until next year!"

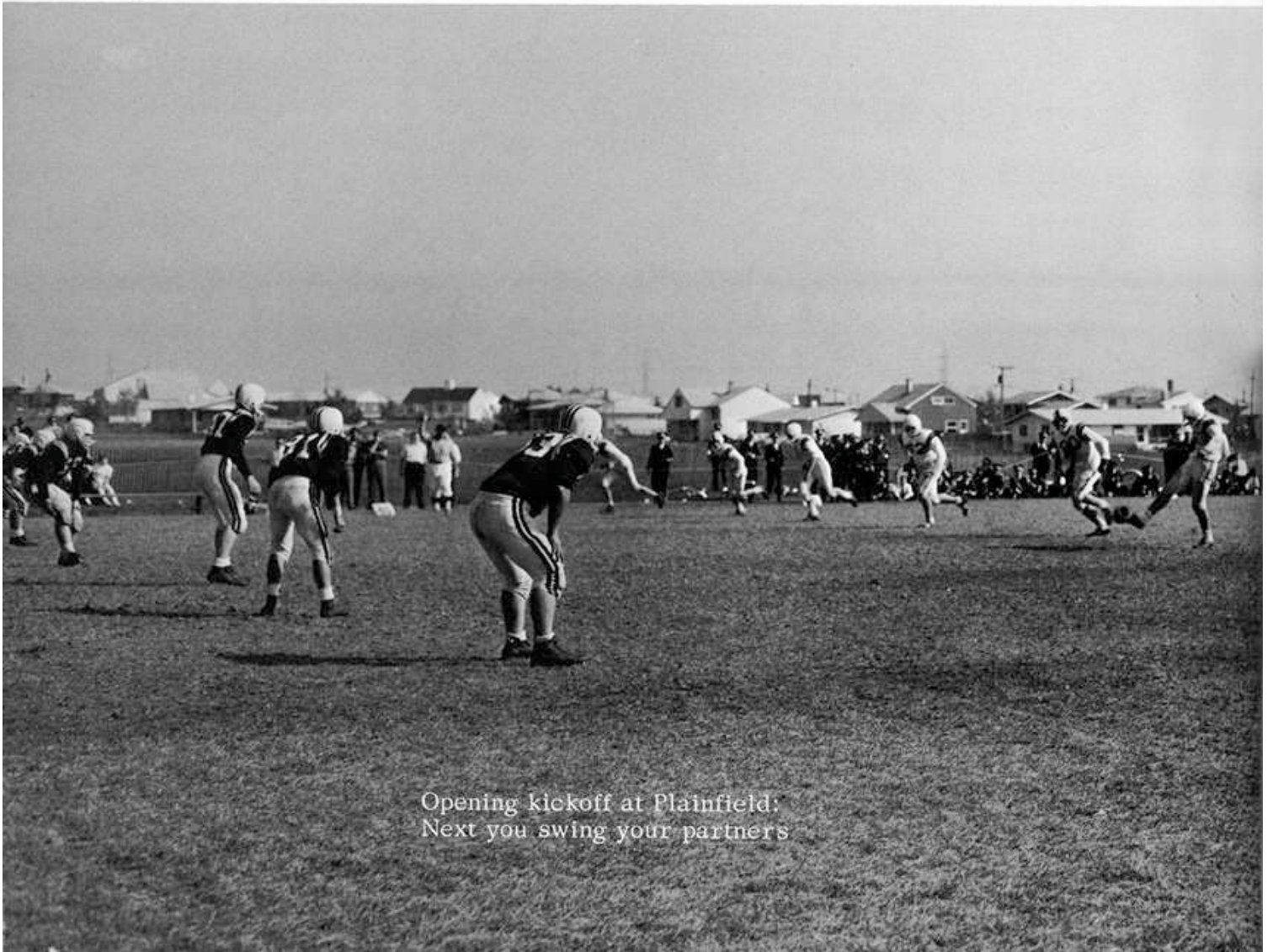

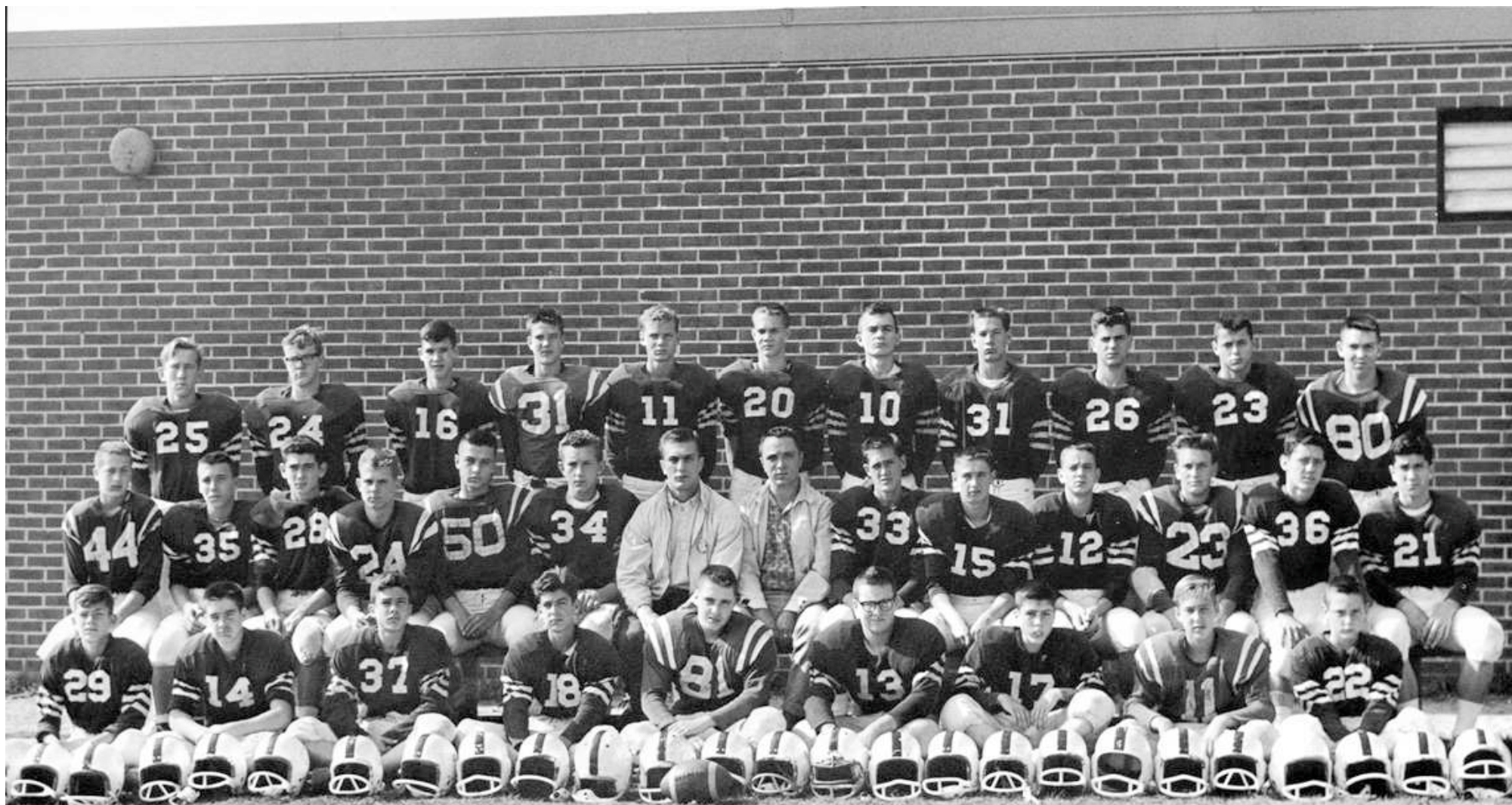

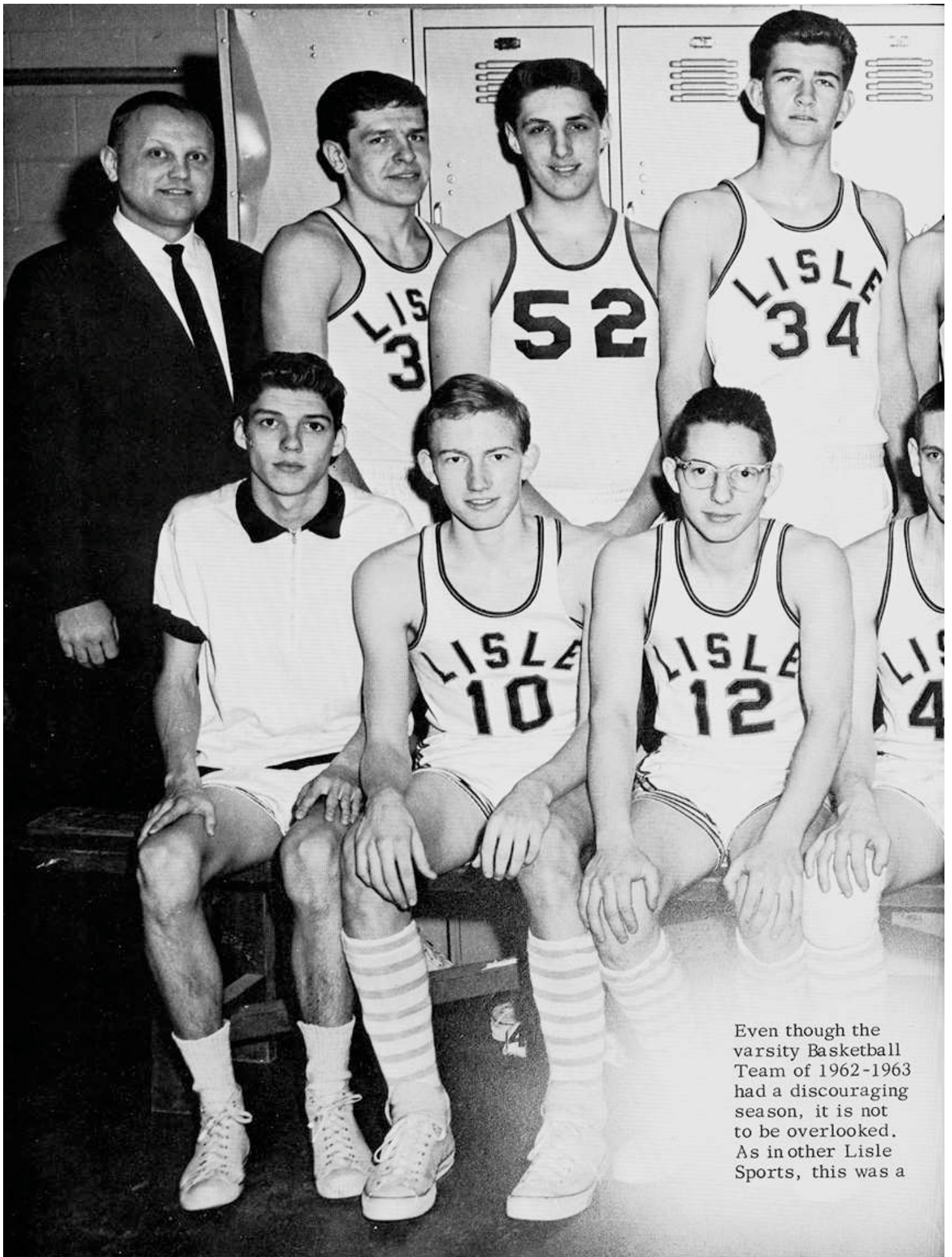


The Junior Lions of 1962, with some fine material, had a good season. Having hard-running backs and a hard-working line, they played every game to the utmost of their ability.



This picture symbolizes the spirit which the fresh-soph displayed all season.

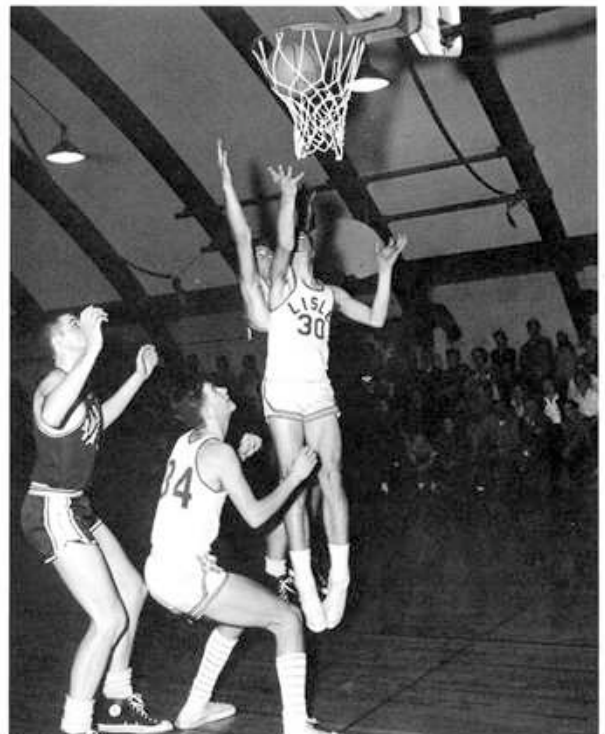

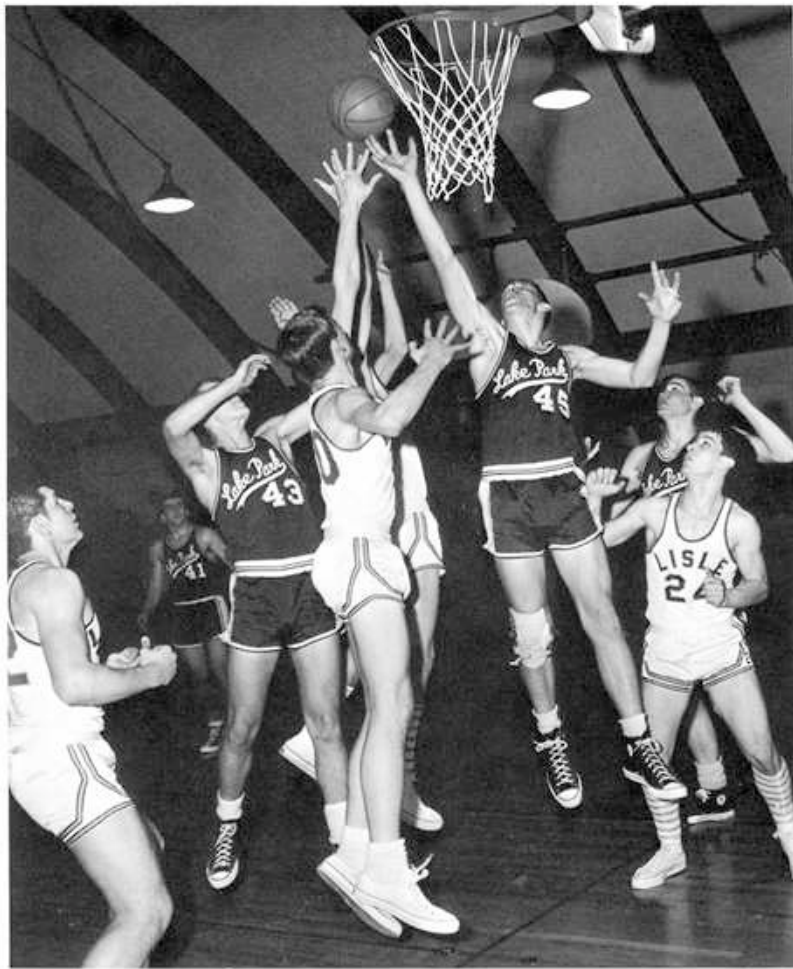


Even though the varsity Basketball Team of 1962-1963 had a discouraging season, it is not to be overlooked. As in other Lisle Sports, this was a

Credit must be given to the hard working cheerleaders, the faithful fans, and last but not least the second and third string players, without whose help this fine season would not have been possible.



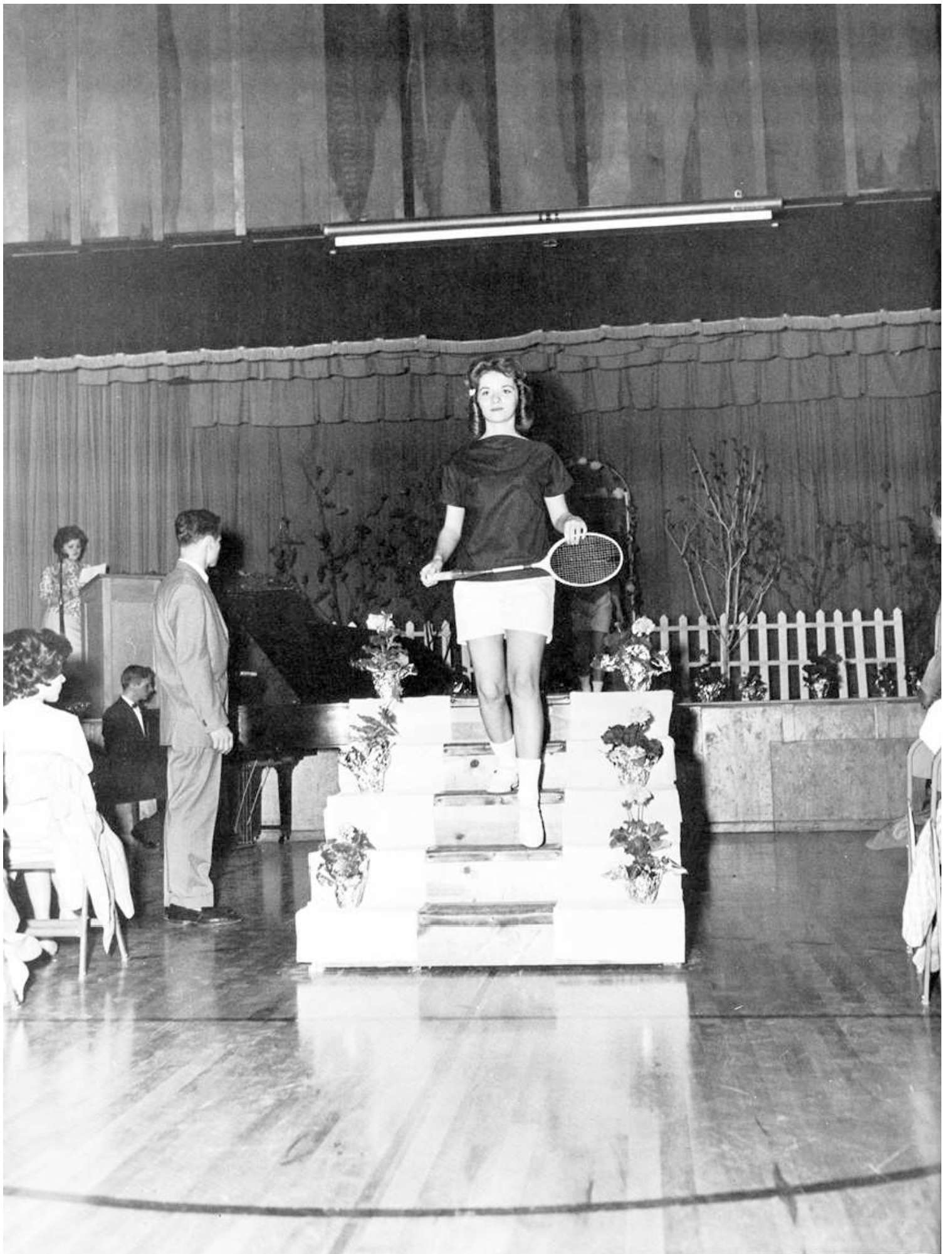
