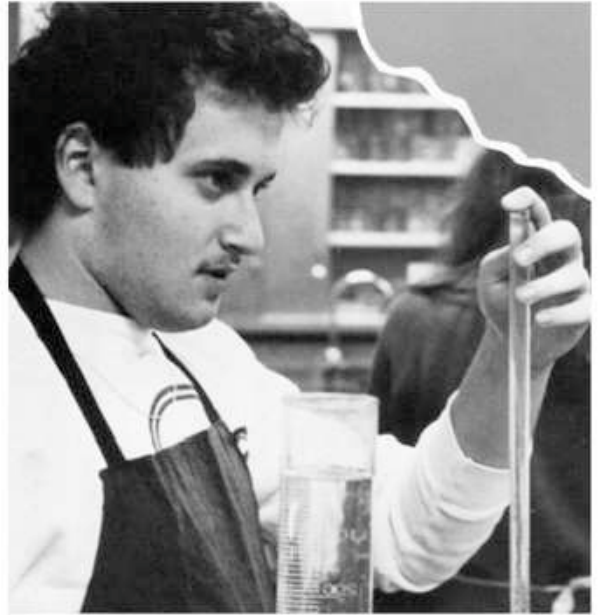

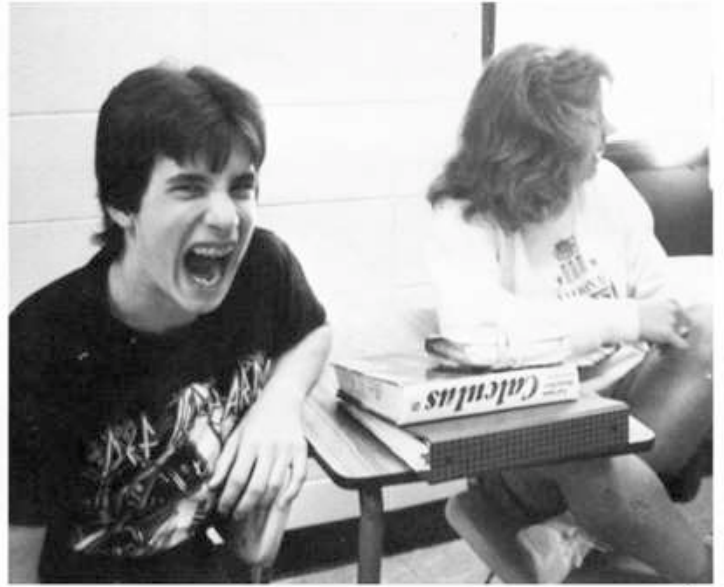

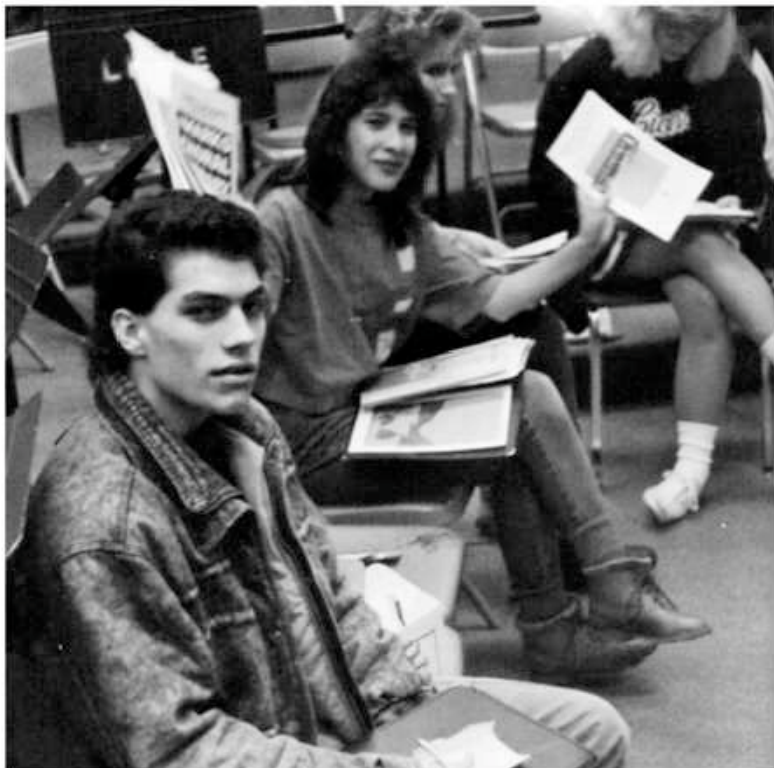

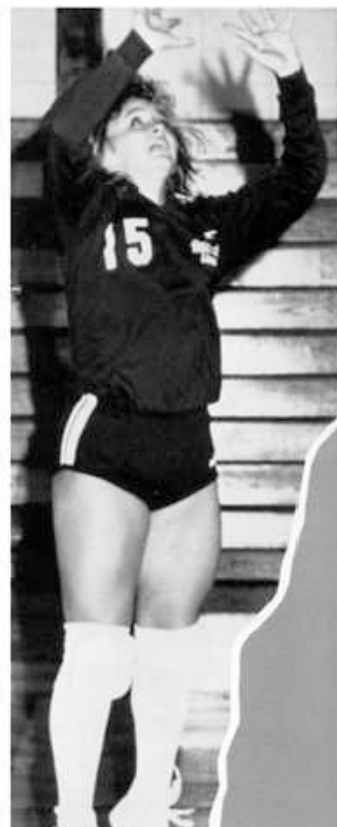
# INTENSITY

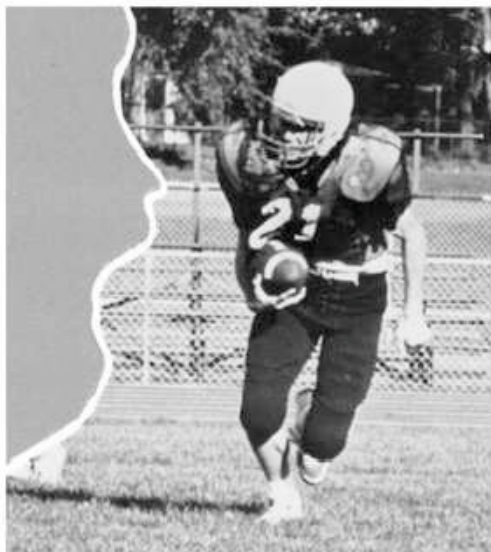

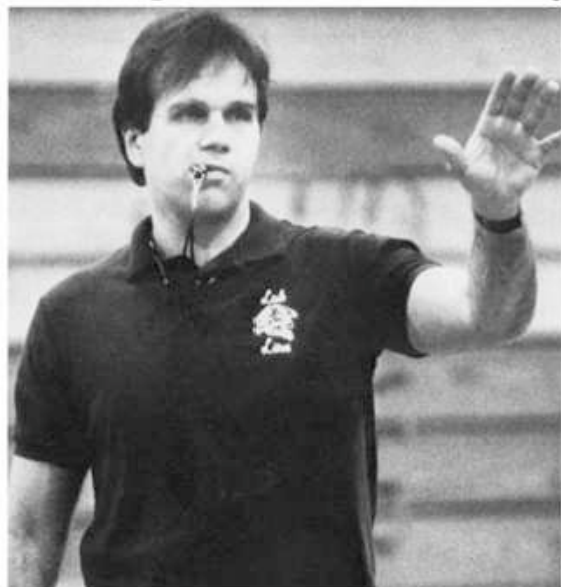
