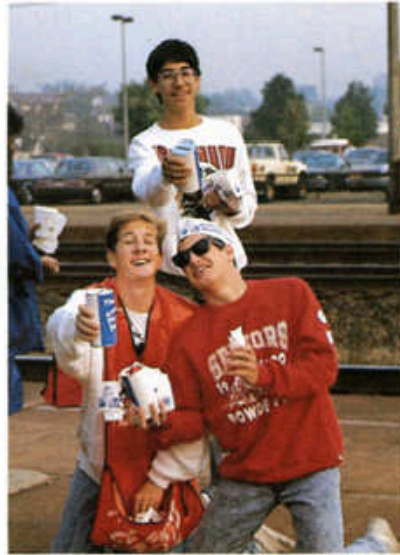

Talking 'bout My Generation

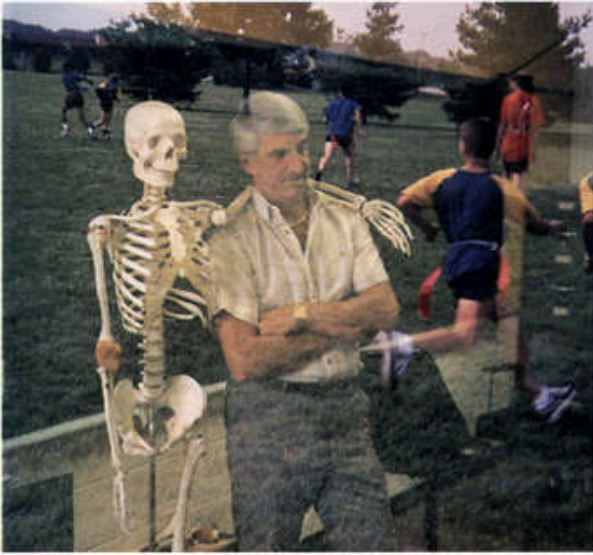

Most students also have jobs, and are helping our community. The S.A.S.E.D. teacher is Mrs. Romano.

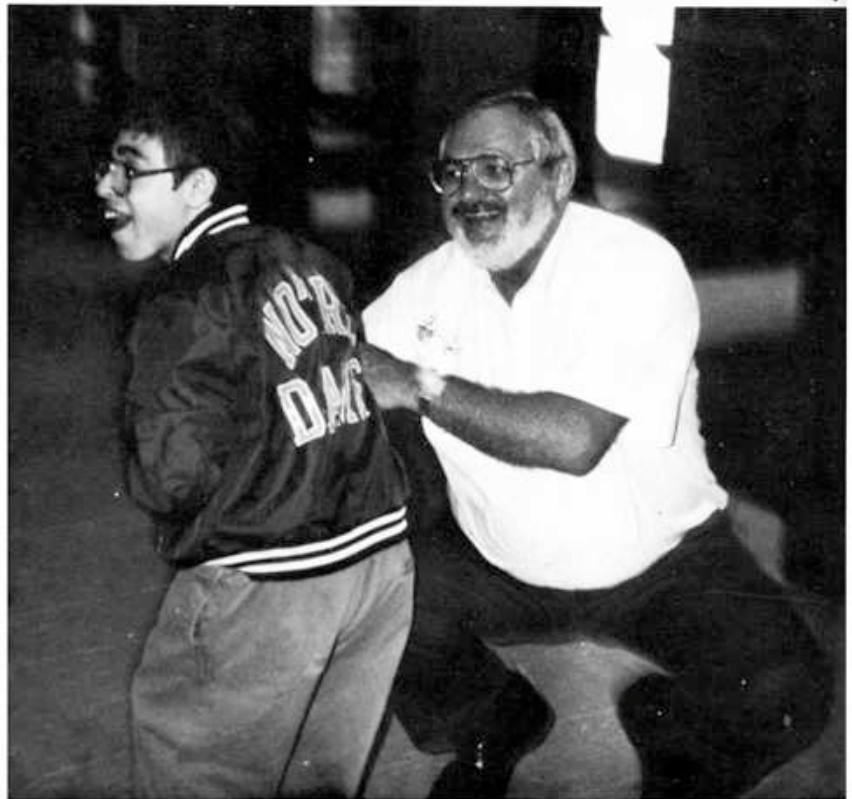
