


The present administration of Lisle Community High is doing an excellent job of fulfilling these responsibilities.








Chorus

The band of Lisle Community High School has been under the direction of Mr. Bartelt for the past two years. We are all proud of the accomplishments and continual growth of the band.






"Ars Gratia Artis"

The track team last year did not exactly shine, but the boys did toil hard. They fared well in the Conference-meet taking third place.






