

"Promises" Set Mood











The Class of 1982 Broadens Horizons

The seniors took first place in float competition and first place overall.


The dance "A Step into the Future" concluded the week with a night full of music provided by Nitelife.

















Students Come and Go













F-S Wrestlers Meet Challenge









F-S Basketball Gets Tough



The Lions hosted the annual Thanksgiving tourney in which they placed first by defeating Waubansie Valley by a score of 72 to 43.







The girls went to Palentine, their only competition. There, the JV achieved second and the freshmen achieved fourth.







The school board discussed various issues, concentrating on a review of the student code of conduct.


Mr. Russ Perry, Lisle board member, resigned in October, because he moved from the district.


Library Changes in Staff, Policy








Mr. King taught Photography, Woods II, Drafting II, and Orientation to Industrial Arts in the morning, and then taught at the junior high in the afternoon.












Science Department Utilizes Computers














History Department Has New Dimensions


Contemporary Problems and American Ethnics expanded the History Department this year.
















Three Required of Sophs







John Bartels represented Lisle in the State Cross Country Meet. Sophomores carried the Lisle tradition for spirit and pride.






