



Broadway . . . Here We Come!








Congress Involves All Aspects



Jen Sinnick was president with Lisa Speno as her running mate. Denise O'Sullivan was the secretary.





















Freshmen, Sophomores, Go Undefeated



In Regionals Liste placed seventh out of thirteen teams. Mike Denklau placed fifteenth in this meet, was voted M.V.P., and was elected team captain.










The girls' team trained extensively to record 7 wins and 5 losses, which resulted in their best record ever. This accomplishment proves that the Lions have what it takes to be a winner.










Jason Konder's outstanding record made him the Frosh-Soph Most Valuable wrestler.














Record Breakers



Victor Victorious





Through hard work and determination, both squads strove for excellence. The Freshmen squad's season highlight was winning their own Freshman Tournament.




















The school board was kept busy tending to school matters therefore making it difficult to take a group picture.







College and career information was distributed through the Career Resource Center. Mrs. Newman directed these activities and aided students with usage of the computer in the center.














Working Together

Transformations Evident
















Computers Aid in Business Future



Corps Precision




