
Today, those teenagers are now mothers and fathers. We have replaced them




Summer Fun In Lisle




Running Scared













Bust Anyone!


Lisle's Real Men












Spoon River


Edgar Lee Masters wrote the play originally as poems describing actual people in a small town in Illinois. The town was so scandalized, they refused to say his name or teach about him in school.
