BACK TO REALITY









It was a beautiful fall day, perfect weather conditions for a football game. This year, Lisle had Coal City as its opponents for the Home-


coming game.






Of course, there were plenty of fifties songs to enjoy.
















COUNTING THE PIECES

WORD TREASURY


To some people, English is only a required class that they have to go to everyday, "only this and nothing more," but English is really the foundation of our society's language.











Symphonic band is composed of juniors, seniors, and some sophomores. The music performed is more technically advanced and requires more experience to perform it.


"Having the two bands this year has been a benefit because it allows you more individual growth in music and personal playing," said Junior Theresa Gregoire.



















Now that they are not on the bottom of the pile, the sophomores are finally starting to feel at home.

As the juniors move on to their senior year, the past friendships and relationships of the 96-97 school year will be remembered for the rest of their lives.


















THE GOOD, THE BAD, AND THE UGLY





Mr. Sanko said, "We must be better than six and three in ninety-seven, because we were better than six and three in ninety-six."







every home game, cheerleaders cheer at every away game.






SHOOTING STARS





RACING TO THE FUTURE








